APPENDIX 4C COMMENTARY Quarter ended 30 June 2020

PERTH AUSTRALIA, 27 JULY 2020: PARKD Ltd ("PARKD" or the "Company") (ASX:PKD) lodges the attached Appendix 4C Quarterly Cashflow Report for the 12 months period ended 30 June 2020 and provides the following update on its activities.

The Company completed further technical design works on behalf of local councils to assist them in accessing funding for a number of commuter car parks as part of the Federal Government's \$650M National Commuter Car Parking project. In addition, the Company has identified a strong pipeline of car park construction projects for which it is either actively tendering or engaging with end clients and builders to provide technical design services.

Effective 1 April 2020, the Company implemented cost savings initiatives including a 20% reduction in salaries, the suspension of directors' fees for the remainder of the financial year and the elimination of all non-essential expenditure. These measures were introduced to preserve cash and maintain the Company's capacity to continue bidding on new government funded car parking infrastructure projects.

Net operating cash outflows for the April to June quarter totalled \$306,000 and the Company's cash reserves at 30 June 2020 were \$1.1m. Expenditure for the quarter consisted of general administrative and compliance costs that were consistent with the Company's stated business objectives.

With regards to item 6.1 of the Appendix 4C totalling \$47,000, the Company advises that it consisted of salary and superannuation payments to an executive director. Non-executive directors received no remuneration during the quarter.

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ABOUT PARKD LTD

PARKD has intellectual property rights to aspects of an innovative lightweight concrete "modular" car parking system. The modular aspect of the system and the minimising of structural weight provides the ability to relocate the car park or adapt it to parking demands by adding or subtracting to the structural levels of the car park. The PARKD Car Park System is currently designed for single or multi rise arrangements of up to 6 levels including ground level. The PARKD Car Park System is prefabricated offsite with the potential to reduce construction time, cost and site disruption when compared to traditional construction methods.
