The Directors have determined pursuant to Regulation 7.11.37 of the *Corporations Regulations 2001* (Cth) that the persons eligible to vote at the Meeting are those who are registered Shareholders as at 5.00pm (AWST) on Sunday, 19 November 2023.

The Explanatory Memorandum provides additional information on matters to be considered at the Meeting. The Explanatory Memorandum and the Proxy Form, form part of the Notice.

Terms and abbreviations used in the Notice are defined in Schedule 1.

Agenda

1 Annual Report

To consider the Annual Report of the Company and its controlled entities for the financial year ended 30 June 2023, which includes the Financial Report, the Directors' Report and the Auditor's Report.

Note: There is no requirement for Shareholders to approve the Annual Report.

2 Resolutions

Resolution 1 – Adoption of Remuneration Report

To consider and, if thought fit, to pass with or without amendment, as a **non-binding ordinary resolution** the following:

"That, for the purposes of section 250R(2) of the Corporations Act, the Remuneration Report for the financial year ended 30 June 2023 be adopted by Shareholders, on the terms and conditions in the Explanatory Memorandum."

Note: The vote on this resolution is advisory only and does not bind the Directors of the Company.

Resolution 2 – Re-election of Director – Bronte Howson

To consider and, if thought fit, to pass with or without amendment, as an ordinary resolution the following:

"That Mr Bronte Howson, who retires by rotation in accordance with rule 7.3(a) of the Constitution, Listing Rule 14.4 and for all other purposes, and, being eligible and offering himself for re-election, is re-elected as a Director on the terms and conditions in the Explanatory Memorandum."

Resolution 3 – Approval of 10% Placement Facility (LR 7.1A)

To consider and, if thought fit, to pass with or without amendment, as a **special resolution** the following:

"That, pursuant to and in accordance with Listing Rule 7.1A and for all other purposes, Shareholders approve the issue of Equity Securities totalling up to 10% of the issued capital of the Company at the time of issue, calculated in accordance with the formula prescribed in Listing Rule 7.1A.2 and on the terms and conditions in the Explanatory Memorandum."

Resolution 4 – Approval of issue of Shares to Mr Bronte Howson in lieu of fees

To consider and, if thought fit, to pass with or without amendment, as an ordinary resolution the following:

"That, pursuant to and in accordance with Listing Rule 10.11 and for all other purposes, Shareholders approve the issue of up to 1,765,909 Remuneration Shares (equivalent to \$35,000 plus superannuation) to Mr Bronte Howson (or his nominee/s), on the terms and conditions in the Explanatory Memorandum."

Resolution 5 – Approval of issue of Shares to Peter McUtchen in lieu of short term incentive cash bonus

To consider and, if thought fit, to pass with or without amendment, as an ordinary resolution the following:

"That, pursuant to and in accordance with Listing Rule 10.11 and for all other purposes, Shareholders approve the issue of up to 2,244,898 Shares in lieu of short term incentive cash bonus of \$55,000 (excluding superannuation) to Mr Peter McUtchen (or his nominee/s), on the terms and conditions in the Explanatory Memorandum."

Voting exclusions

Pursuant to the Listing Rules, the Company will disregard any votes cast in favour of:

(a) **Resolution 3**: if at the time of the Meeting, the Company is proposing to make an issue of Equity Securities under Listing Rule 7.1A.2, by or on behalf of any persons who are expected to participate in, or who will obtain a material benefit as a result of,

the proposed issue (except a benefit solely by reason of being a Shareholder), or any of their respective associates.

- (b) **Resolution 4**: by or on behalf of Mr Bronte Howson (or his nominee/s), and any other person who will obtain a material benefit as a result of the issue of the Remuneration Shares (except a benefit solely by reason of being a Shareholder), or any of their respective associates.
- (c) **Resolution 5**: by or on behalf of Mr Peter McUtchen (or his nominee/s), and any other person who will obtain a material benefit as a result of the issue of the Shares (except a benefit solely by reason of being a Shareholder), or any of their respective associates.

The above voting exclusions do not apply to a vote cast in favour of the relevant Resolution by:

- (a) a person as proxy or attorney for a person who is entitled to vote, in accordance with directions given to the proxy or attorney to vote on the Resolution in that way;
- (b) the Chair as proxy or attorney for a person who is entitled to vote, in accordance with a direction given to the Chair to vote on the Resolution as the Chair decides; or
- (c) a holder acting solely in a nominee, trustee, custodial or other fiduciary capacity on behalf of a beneficiary provided the following conditions are met:
 - the beneficiary provides written confirmation to the holder that the beneficiary is not excluded from voting, and is not an associate of a person excluded from voting, on the Resolution; and
 - (ii) the holder votes on the Resolution in accordance with directions given by the beneficiary to the holder to vote in that way.

Voting prohibitions

Resolution 1: In accordance with sections 250BD and 250R of the Corporations Act, a vote on these Resolutions must not be cast (in any capacity) by or on behalf of a member of the Key Management Personnel, details of whose remuneration are included in the Remuneration Report, or a Closely Related Party of such a member.

A vote may be cast by such person if the vote is not cast on behalf of a person who is excluded from voting on these Resolutions, and:

- (a) the person is appointed as a proxy by writing that specifies the way the proxy is to vote on the Resolution; or
- (b) the voter is the Chair and the appointment of the Chair as proxy does not specify the way the proxy is to vote on the Resolution, but expressly authorises the Chair to exercise the proxy even if the Resolution is connected with the remuneration of a member of the Key Management Personnel.

Resolution 4 and Resolution 5: In accordance with section 250BD of the Corporations Act, a person appointed as a proxy must not vote, on the basis of that appointment, on this Resolution if:

- (a) the proxy is either a member of the Key Management Personnel or a Closely Related Party of such member; and
- (b) the appointment does not specify the way the proxy is to vote on the Resolution.

However, the above prohibition does not apply if:

- (a) the proxy is the Chair; and
- (b) the appointment expressly authorises the Chair to exercise the proxy even though the Resolution is connected directly or indirectly with remuneration of a member of the Key Management Personnel.

Explanatory Memorandum

1. Introduction

The Explanatory Memorandum has been prepared for the information of Shareholders in connection with the business to be conducted at the Meeting to be held at The Park Business Centre, 45 Ventnor Avenue, West Perth WA 6005 on Tuesday, 21 November 2023 10am (AWST).

The Explanatory Memorandum forms part of the Notice which should be read in its entirety. The Explanatory Memorandum contains the terms and conditions on which the Resolutions will be voted.

The Explanatory Memorandum includes the following information to assist Shareholders in deciding how to vote on the Resolutions:

A Proxy Form is located at the end of the Explanatory Memorandum.

2. Voting and attendance information

Shareholders should read the Notice including the Explanatory Memorandum carefully before deciding how to vote on the Resolutions.

2.1 Voting in person

To vote in person, attend the Meeting on the date and at the place set out above.

2.2 Voting by proxy

A Proxy Form is attached to the Notice. This is to be used by Shareholders if they wish to appoint a representative (a 'proxy') to vote in their place. All Shareholders are encouraged to vote by completing and returning the Proxy Form to the Company in accordance with the instructions thereon. Lodgement of a Proxy Form will not preclude a Shareholder from attending and voting at the Meeting in person.

Please note that:

- (i) a member of the Company entitled to attend and vote at the Meeting is entitled to appoint a proxy;
- (ii) a proxy need not be a member of the Company; and
- (iii) a member of the Company entitled to cast two or more votes may appoint two proxies and may specify the proportion or number of votes each proxy is appointed to exercise, but where the proportion or number is not specified, each proxy may exercise half of the votes.

The enclosed Proxy Form provides further details on appointing proxies and lodging Proxy Forms.

Section 250BB(1) of the Corporations Act provides that an appointment of a proxy may specify the way the proxy is to vote on a particular resolution and, if it does:

- (i) the proxy need not vote on a show of hands, but if the proxy does so, the proxy must vote that way (i.e. as directed);
- (ii) if the proxy has 2 or more appointments that specify different ways to vote on the resolution the proxy must not vote on a show of hands;
- (iii) if the proxy is the Chair of the meeting at which the resolution is voted on the proxy must vote on a poll, and must vote that way (i.e. as directed); and
- (iv) if the proxy is not the Chair the proxy need not vote on the poll, but if the proxy does so, the proxy must vote that way (i.e. as directed).

Section 250BC of the Corporations Act provides that, if:

- (i) an appointment of a proxy specifies the way the proxy is to vote on a particular resolution at a meeting of the Company's members;
- (ii) the appointed proxy is not the chair of the meeting;
- (iii) at the meeting, a poll is duly demanded on the resolution; and
- (iv) either the proxy is not recorded as attending the meeting or the proxy does not vote on the resolution,

the Chair of the meeting is taken, before voting on the resolution closes, to have been appointed as the proxy for the purposes of voting on the resolution at the meeting. Your proxy voting instruction must be received by 10am (AWST) on Sunday, 19 November 2023, being not later than 48 hours before the commencement of the Meeting.

2.3 Chair's voting intentions

If the Chair is appointed as your proxy and you have not specified the way the Chair is to vote on Resolution 1, Resolution 4 and Resolution 5 by signing and returning the Proxy Form, you are considered to have provided the Chair with an express authorisation for the Chair to vote the proxy in accordance with the Chair's intention, even though the Resolutions are connected directly or indirectly with the remuneration of a member of the Key Management Personnel of the Company.

The Chair intends to exercise all available proxies in favour of all Resolutions, unless the Shareholder has expressly indicated a different voting intention.

2.4 Submitting questions

Shareholders may submit questions in advance of the Meeting to the Company. Questions must be submitted by emailing the Company Secretary at kevin.hart@automicgroup.com.au by Thursday, 16 November 2023.

Shareholders will also have the opportunity to submit questions during the Meeting in respect to the formal items of business. To ask a question during the Meeting, please follow the instructions from the Chair.

The Chair will attempt to respond to the questions during the Meeting. The Chair will request prior to a Shareholder asking a question that they identify themselves (including the entity name of their shareholding and the number of Shares they hold).

2.5 Notice of members' rights

Shareholders have the right to elect to:

- (a) be sent certain documents in physical form;
- (b) be sent certain documents in electronic form; or
- (c) not be sent certain documents at all.

A notice of these rights and how Shareholders can make an election and/or request is available on the Company's website at <u>https://www.parkdgroup.com/right-to-receive-documents/</u>.

3. Annual Report

In accordance with section 317 of the Corporations Act and the Company's Constitution, Shareholders will be offered the opportunity to discuss the Financial Report, Directors' Report and Auditor's Report for the financial year ended 30 June 2023.

There is no requirement for Shareholders to approve these reports.

At the Meeting, Shareholders will be offered the opportunity to:

(a) discuss the Financial Report, Directors' Report and Auditor's Report, which are included in the Company's Annual Report available online at

<u>http://www.parkdgroup.com/asx_announcements/</u> or on the ASX platform for "PKD" at www.asx.com.au;

- (b) ask questions about, or comment on, the management of the Company; and
- (c) ask the auditor questions about the conduct of the audit and the preparation and content of the Auditor's Report.

In addition to taking questions at the Meeting, written questions to the Chair about the management of the Company, or to the Company's auditor about:

- (a) the preparation and content of the Auditor's Report;
- (b) the conduct of the audit;
- (c) accounting policies adopted by the Company in relation to the preparation of the financial statements; and
- (d) the independence of the auditor in relation to the conduct of the audit,

may be submitted no later than five business days before the Meeting to the Company Secretary at the Company's registered office.

The Company will not provide a hard copy of the Company's Annual Report to Shareholders unless specifically requested to do so.

4. Resolution 1 – Adoption of Remuneration Report

4.1 General

In accordance with subsection 250R(2) of the Corporations Act, the Company must put the Remuneration Report to the vote of Shareholders. The Directors' Report contains the Remuneration Report which sets out the remuneration policy for the Company and the remuneration arrangements in place for the executive Directors, specified executives and non-executive Directors.

In accordance with subsection 250R(3) of the Corporations Act, Resolution 1 is advisory only and does not bind the Directors. If Resolution 1 is not passed, the Directors will not be required to alter any of the arrangements in the Remuneration Report.

If the Company's Remuneration Report receives a 'no' vote of 25% or more (**Strike**) at two consecutive annual general meetings, Shareholders will have the opportunity to remove the whole Board, except the managing director (if any).

Where a resolution on the Remuneration Report receives a Strike at two consecutive annual general meetings, the Company will be required to put to Shareholders at the second annual general meeting a resolution on whether another meeting should be held (within 90 days) at which all Directors (other than the managing director, if any) who were in office at the date of approval of the applicable Directors' Report must stand for re-election.

A Strike was not received by the Company at its previous year's annual general meeting. If the Remuneration Report receives a Strike at this Meeting, Shareholders should be aware that if a

second Strike is received at the 2024 annual general meeting, this may result in the re-election of the Board.

The Chair will allow a reasonable opportunity for Shareholders as a whole to ask about or make comments on the Remuneration Report.

4.2 Board recommendation

Resolution 1 is an ordinary resolution.

Given the personal interests of all Directors in this Resolution, the Board makes no recommendation to Shareholders regarding this Resolution.

5. Resolution 2 – Re-election of Director – Bronte Howson

5.1 General

Rule 7.3(a) of the Constitution requires that one third of the Directors (excluding the Managing Director) must retire at each annual general meeting (or if that is not a whole number, the whole number nearest to one third, rounded down). Rule 7.3(c) of the Constitution requires that the Directors to retire are those who have held their office as Director for the longest period since their last election or appointment to that office.

Rule 7.3(d) of the Constitution provides that a Director who retires in accordance with rule 7.3(a) is eligible for re-election.

Additionally, Listing Rule 14.4 provides that a Director (excluding a Managing Director) must not hold office without re-election past the third annual general meeting following that Director's appointment or three years, whichever is longer.

Bronte Howson was elected at the annual general meeting held on 27 November 2020 and has held office the longest since being last elected.

Accordingly, Mr Howson will retire as a Director at this Meeting and, being eligible, seeks approval to be re-elected as a Director pursuant to Resolution 2.

5.2 Mr Bronte Howson

Mr Howson has experience in the Australian automotive retailing industry in a career spanning more than 35 years. He was appointed CEO of Automotive Holdings Group Limited (ASX: AHG) in January 2000 and became managing director in 2007 until 2017. Mr Howson led AHG from being a private group with operations largely based in Western Australia to becoming the nation's leading listed specialist automotive and logistics group, establishing a track record of driving profitable growth.

Mr Howson is President and a life member of the East Perth Football Club and the Western Australian Football League. Mr Howson was awarded honorary life membership of Rocky Bay for his support of the charity. In 2016, Mr Howson was awarded the Order of Australia Medal in the Queen's Birthday honours list for services to the automotive industry, sport and to charities.

Mr Howson does not currently hold any other material directorships, other than as disclosed in this Notice.

Mr Howson has acknowledged to the Company that he will have sufficient time to fulfil his responsibilities as a Director.

Mr Howson is Non-Executive Chairman of the Company and is a member of the Audit and Risk Committee and is Chair of the Remuneration and Nomination Committee.

If elected, Mr Howson is not considered by the Board to be an independent Director by reason of his substantial holding in the Company.

5.3 Board recommendation

The Board (other than Mr Howson who has a personal interest in the outcome of this Resolution) recommends that Shareholders vote in favour of Resolution 2 for the following reasons:

- (a) Mr Howson is a highly experienced and qualified long-standing Board member; and
- (b) Mr Howson has an in-depth knowledge and understanding of the Company and its business, and his continuing role as a member of the Board will benefit the Company.

5.4 Additional information

If Resolution 2 is passed, Mr Howson will be re-elected as Non-Executive Chairman of the Company with effect from the conclusion of the Meeting.

If Resolution 2 is not passed, Mr Howson will not be re-elected as a Director. The Board may consider an appointment to fill a casual vacancy pursuant to the Constitution, with ratification at the Company's next annual general meeting.

Resolution 2 is an ordinary resolution.

6. Resolution 3 – Approval of 10% Placement Facility (LR 7.1A)

6.1 General

Listing Rule 7.1A enables an eligible entity to issue Equity Securities up to 10% of its issued share capital through placements over a 12-month period after the annual general meeting (**10% Placement Facility**). The 10% Placement Facility is in addition to the Company's 15% annual placement capacity under Listing Rule 7.1.

Resolution 3 seeks Shareholder approval to provide the Company with the ability to issue Equity Securities under the 10% Placement Facility during the 10% Placement Period (refer to Section 6.2(f) below). The number of Equity Securities to be issued under the 10% Placement Facility will be determined in accordance with the formula prescribed in Listing Rule 7.1A.2 (refer to Section 6.2(c) below).

If Resolution 3 is passed, the Company will be able to issue Equity Securities up to the combined 25% limit in Listing Rules 7.1 and 7.1A without any further Shareholder approval.

If Resolution 3 is not passed, the Company will not be able to access the additional 10% capacity to issue Equity Securities without Shareholder approval provided for in Listing Rule 7.1A and will remain subject to the 15% limit on issuing Equity Securities without Shareholder approval in Listing Rule 7.1.

6.2 Listing Rule 7.1A

(a) Is the Company an eligible entity?

An eligible entity for the purposes of Listing Rule 7.1A is an entity that is not included in the S&P/ASX 300 Index and has a market capitalisation of \$300 million or less.

The Company is an eligible entity as it is not included in the S&P/ASX 300 Index and has a market capitalisation of approximately \$2.54 million, based on the closing price of Shares (\$0.025) on 4 October 2023.

(b) What Equity Securities can be issued?

Any Equity Securities issued under the 10% Placement Facility must be in the same class as an existing quoted class of Equity Securities of the eligible entity.

As at the date of the Notice, the Company has one quoted class of Equity Securities on issue, being Shares.

(c) How many Equity Securities can be issued?

Listing Rule 7.1A.2 provides that under the approved 10% Placement Facility, the Company may issue or agree to issue a number of Equity Securities calculated in accordance with the following formula:

(A x D) – E

Where:

- **A** = is the number of Shares on issue at the commencement of the Relevant Period:
 - (A) plus the number of fully paid Shares issued in the Relevant Period under an exception in Listing Rule 7.2 other than exception 9, 16 or 17;
 - (B) plus the number of fully paid Shares issued in the Relevant Period on the conversion of convertible securities within Listing Rule 7.2 exception 9 where:
 - (1) the convertible securities were issued or agreed to be issued before the commencement of the Relevant Period; or
 - (2) the issue of, or agreement to issue, the convertible securities was approved, or taken under the Listing Rules to have been approved, under Listing Rule 7.1 or Listing Rule 7.4;
 - (C) plus the number of fully paid Shares issued in the Relevant Period under an agreement to issue securities within Listing Rule 7.2 exception 16 where:
 - (1) the agreement was entered into before the commencement of the Relevant Period; or

- (2) the agreement or issue was approved, or taken under the Listing Rules to have been approved, under Listing Rule 7.1 or Listing Rule 7.4;
- (D) plus the number of partly paid Shares that became fully paid Shares in the Relevant Period;
- (E) plus the number of fully paid Shares issued in the Relevant Period with approval under Listing Rule 7.1 or Listing Rule 7.4; and
- (F) less the number of fully paid Shares cancelled in the Relevant Period.

Note that 'A' has the same meaning in Listing Rule 7.1 when calculating the Company's 15% annual placement capacity, and 'Relevant Period' has the relevant meaning given in Listing Rule 7.1 and 7.1A.2, namely, the 12 month-period immediately preceding the date of the issue or agreement.

- **D** = is 10%.
- **E** = is the number of Equity Securities issued or agreed to be issued under Listing Rule 7.1A.2 in the Relevant Period where the issue or agreement has not been subsequently approved by Shareholders under Listing Rule 7.4.

(d) What is the interaction with Listing Rule 7.1?

The Company's ability to issue Equity Securities under Listing Rule 7.1A will be in addition to its 15% annual placement capacity under Listing Rule 7.1.

(e) At what price can the Equity Securities be issued?

Any Equity Securities issued under Listing Rule 7.1A must be issued for a cash consideration per Equity Security which is not less than 75% of the VWAP of Equity Securities in the same class calculated over the 15 Trading Days on which trades in that class were recorded immediately before:

- (i) the date on which the price at which the Equity Securities are to be issued is agreed by the Company and the recipient of the Equity Securities; or
- (ii) if the Equity Securities are not issued within 10 Trading Days of the date in paragraph 6.2(e)(i) above, the date on which the Equity Securities are issued,

(Minimum Issue Price).

(f) When can Equity Securities be issued?

Shareholder approval of the 10% Placement Facility under Listing Rule 7.1A will be valid from the date of the Meeting and will expire on the earlier of:

- (i) the date that is 12 months after the date of the Meeting;
- (ii) the time and date of the Company's next annual general meeting; or

 (iii) the time and date of Shareholder approval of a transaction under Listing Rules 11.1.2 (a significant change to the nature or scale of activities) or 11.2 (disposal of main undertaking),

(10% Placement Period).

(g) What is the effect of Resolution 3?

The effect of Resolution 3 will be to allow the Company to issue the Equity Securities under Listing Rule 7.1A during the 10% Placement Period without further Shareholder approval or using the Company's 15% annual placement capacity under Listing Rule 7.1.

6.3 Specific information required by Listing Rule 7.3A

Pursuant to and in accordance with Listing Rule 7.3A, the following information is provided in relation to the 10% Placement Facility:

(a) Final date for issue

The Company will only issue the Equity Securities under the 10% Placement Facility during the 10% Placement Period (refer to Section 6.2(f) above).

(b) Minimum issue price

Where the Company issues Equity Securities under the 10% Placement Facility, it will only do so for cash consideration and the issue price will be not less than the Minimum Issue Price (refer to Section 6.2(e) above).

(c) Purposes of issues under the 10% Placement Facility

The Company may seek to issue the Equity Securities under the 10% Placement Facility in order to fund future project developments, marketing of the Company's car park system, fees in relation to the Company's intellectual property rights and patent protection, as well as to raise funds for general working capital and corporate overheads. The Company will only make issues under the 10% Placement Capacity for cash consideration.

The Company will comply with the disclosure obligations under Listing Rules 7.1A.4 and 3.10.3 upon issue of any Equity Securities.

(d) Risk of economic and voting dilution

Shareholders should note that there is a risk that:

- the market price for the Company's Equity Securities may be significantly lower on the date of the issue of the Equity Securities than on the date of the Meeting; and
- (ii) the Equity Securities may be issued at a price that is at a discount to the market price for the Company's Equity Securities on the issue date,

which may have an effect on the amount of funds raised by the issue of the Equity Securities.

If this Resolution 3 is approved by Shareholders and the Company issues Equity Securities under the 10% Placement Facility, the existing Shareholders' economic and voting power in the Company may be diluted as shown in the below table (in the case of Options, only if the Options are converted into Shares).

The table below shows the dilution of existing Shareholders based on the current market price of Shares and the current number of Shares for Variable 'A' calculated in accordance with the formula in Listing Rule 7.1A.2 (see Section 6.2(c) above) as at the date of this Notice (**Variable A**), with:

(f) Issues in the past 12 months

The Company has previously obtained Shareholder approval under Listing Rule 7.1A at its annual general meeting held on 25 November 2022.

The Company has not issued or agreed to issue any Equity Securities under Listing Rule 7.1A.2 in the 12 months preceding the date of this Notice.

(g) Voting exclusion statement

At the date of this Notice, the Company is not proposing to make an issue of Equity Securities under Listing Rule 7.1A and has not approached any particular existing Shareholder or security holder or an identifiable class of existing security holder to participate in any such issue.

However, in the event that between the date of this Notice and the date of the Meeting, the Company proposes to make an issue of Equity Securities under Listing Rule 7.1A to one or more existing Shareholders, those Shareholders' votes will be excluded under the voting exclusion statement in the Notice.

6.4 Additional information

Resolution 3 is a **special** resolution and therefore requires approval of 75% of the votes cast by Shareholders present and eligible to vote (in person, by proxy, by attorney or, in the case of a corporate Shareholder, by a corporate representative).

The Board recommends that Shareholders vote in favour of Resolution 3.

7. Resolution 4 – Approval of issue of Shares to Mr Bronte Howson in lieu of fees

7.1 General

The Company is proposing, subject to obtaining Shareholder approval, to issue up to 1,765,909 Shares to Mr Bronte Howson (or his nominee/s), in lieu of cash payment for director fees (**Remuneration Shares**). This issue of the Remuneration Shares is in lieu of cash payments of director fees accrued but not yet paid to Mr Howson for the period between 1 January 2023 and 30 June 2023 (**Salary Reduction Period**).

Mr Howson has previously elected not to receive director fees for the financial years ending 30 June 2021 and 30 June 2022. Mr Howson's agreed remuneration package for the year ending 30 June 2023 was \$70,000 (exclusive of superannuation).

As payment for the period between 1 July 2022 to 31 December 2022 and as approved by Shareholders at the Company's 2022 annual general meeting, Mr Howson was issued 1,618,200 Shares on 22 December 2022, equivalent to \$35,000 (plus superannuation) at a deemed issue price of \$0.0239 per Share (being the volume weighted average price per Share traded on the ASX between 1 July 2022 and 30 September 2022).

The proposed issue of 1,765,909 Remuneration Shares to Mr Howson (or his nominee/s) is based on the following metrics:

The rationale for issuing Mr Howson with the Remuneration Shares is to preserve cash within the Company (in respect of liabilities already assumed) in light of the impact of the current share market conditions and to strengthen the Company's balance sheet. The Remuneration Shares are not subject to any escrow arrangements.

Resolution 4 seeks Shareholder approval pursuant to Listing Rule 10.11 for the issue of up to 1,765,909 Remuneration Shares to Mr Bronte Howson (or his nominee/s).

7.2 Listing Rule 10.11

Listing Rule 10.11 provides that unless one of the exceptions in Listing Rule 10.12 applies, a listed company must not issue or agree to issue Equity Securities to any of the following persons without the approval of its Shareholders:

- (a) a related party (Listing Rule 10.11.1);
- (b) a person who is, or was at any time in the 6 months before the issue or agreement, a substantial holder (30%+) in the company (Listing Rule 10.11.2);
- (c) a person who is, or was at any time in the 6 months before the issue or agreement, a substantial holder (10%+) in the company and who has nominated a director to the board of the company pursuant to a relevant agreement which gives them a right or expectation to do so (Listing Rule 10.11.3);
- (d) an associate of a person referred to in Listing Rules 10.11.1 to 10.11.3 (Listing Rule 10.11.4); or
- (e) a person whose relationship with the company or a person referred to in Listing Rule 10.11.1 or 10.11.4 is such that, in ASX's opinion, the issue or agreement should be approved by its shareholders (Listing Rule 10.11.5).

Mr Bronte Howson is a related party of the Company by virtue of being a Director. Shareholder approval pursuant to Listing Rule 10.11 is therefore required unless an exception applies. It is the view of the Board that the exceptions set out in Listing Rule 10.12 do not apply in the current circumstances.

Approval pursuant to Listing Rule 7.1 is not required for the issue of the Remuneration Shares as approval is being obtained under Listing Rule 10.11. Accordingly, the issue of the Remuneration Shares to Mr Howson (or his nominee/s) will not be included in the Company's 15% annual placement capacity pursuant to Listing Rule 7.1.

The effect of Shareholders passing Resolution 4 will be to allow the Company to issue the Remuneration Shares to Mr Howson (or his nominee/s).

If Resolution 4 is not passed, the Company will not be able to proceed with the issue of up to 1,765,909 Remuneration Shares to Mr Bronte Howson (or his nominee/s), and the Company will have to consider alternative commercial means to remunerate Mr Howson, including by way of a cash payment.

7.3 Specific information required by Listing Rule 10.13

Pursuant to and in accordance with Listing Rule 10.13, the following information is provided in relation to the proposed issue of the Remuneration Shares:

- (a) The Remuneration Shares will be issued to Mr Bronte Howson (or his nominee/s).
- (b) Mr Howson is a related party of the Company by virtue of being a Director and falls into the category stipulated by Listing Rule 10.11.1. If Mr Howson elects for the Remuneration Shares to be granted to a nominee, that person will fall into the category stipulated by Listing Rule 10.11.4.
- (c) The maximum number of Remuneration Shares to be issued to Mr Howson (or his nominee/s) is 1,765,909.
- (d) The Remuneration Shares will be issued as fully paid ordinary shares and will rank equally in all respects with the Company's existing Shares on issue.
- (e) The Remuneration Shares will be issued to Mr Howson (or his nominee/s) as soon as practicable following the Meeting and in any event not later than one month after the Meeting.
- (f) The Remuneration Shares will be issued for nil cash consideration and will be provided in lieu of Mr Howson's director salary/fees during the Salary Reduction Period.
- (g) The current total annual remuneration package of Mr Howson as at the date of this Notice is \$70,000 (exclusive of superannuation). Mr Howson may also receive performance related compensation via share-based payments following receipt of Shareholder approval. For the financial year ended 30 June 2023, the remuneration of Mr Howson was \$85,605 (inclusive of superannuation and share-based payments).
- (h) There are no other material terms to the proposed issue of the Remuneration Shares.
- (i) A voting exclusion statement is included in the Notice.

7.4 Chapter 2E of the Corporations Act

In accordance with Chapter 2E of the Corporations Act, in order to give a financial benefit to a related party, the Company must:

- (a) obtain Shareholder approval in the manner set out in section 217 to 227 of the Corporations Act; and
- (b) give the benefit within 15 months following such approval,

unless the giving of the financial benefit falls within an exception set out in sections 210 to 216 of the Corporations Act.

The proposed issue of the Remuneration Shares constitutes giving a financial benefit to a related party of the Company.

The Board (with Mr Howson abstaining) considers that Shareholder approval pursuant to Chapter 2E of the Corporations Act is not required in respect of the issue of the Remuneration Shares because the Remuneration Shares are considered by the Board as reasonable remuneration as they are being issued in lieu of an agreed percentage of director salary/fees. Therefore, the issue of the Remuneration Shares falls within the exception stipulated by section 211 of the Corporations Act.

7.5 Additional information

Resolution 4 is an ordinary resolution.

The Board (other than Mr Bronte Howson who has a personal interest in the outcome of this Resolution) recommend that Shareholders vote in favour of Resolution 4.

8. Resolution 5 – Approval of issue of Shares to Peter McUtchen in lieu of short term incentive cash bonus

8.1 General

The Company is proposing, subject to obtaining Shareholder approval, to issue up to 2,244,898 Shares to the Company's Managing Director, Mr Peter McUtchen (or his nominee/s), in lieu of cash payments pursuant to the short term incentive award granted for the financial year ended 30 June 2023 (being \$55,000 exclusive of superannuation).

Mr McUtchen has elected, and the Board has approved, that Mr McUtchen's entitlement to his short term incentive cash bonus of \$55,000 (excluding superannuation) (**STI Bonus**) be awarded to Mr McUtchen wholly or partially in Shares.

The maximum number of Shares to be granted equates to approximately 25% of Mr McUtchen's total fixed remuneration for the year ended 30 June 2023 (being \$221,000 inclusive of superannuation), and has been calculated based on a deemed issued price of \$0.0245 per Share (being the 10-day VWAP of Shares up to and including 4 October 2023).

The rationale for issuing Mr McUtchen with Shares is to preserve cash within the Company (in respect of liabilities already assumed) in light of the impact of the current share market conditions and to strengthen the Company's balance sheet and to further increase Mr McUtchen's alignment with the success of the Company. The 2,244,898 Shares are not subject to any escrow arrangements.

Resolution 5 seeks Shareholder approval pursuant to Listing Rule 10.11 for the issue of up to 2,244,898 Shares to Mr Peter McUtchen (or his nominee/s).

8.2 Listing Rule 10.11

A summary of Listing Rule 10.11 is set out in Section 7.2 above.

Mr Peter McUtchen is a related party of the Company by virtue of being a Director. Shareholder approval pursuant to Listing Rule 10.11 is therefore required unless an exception applies. It is the view of the Board that the exceptions set out in Listing Rule 10.12 do not apply in the current circumstances.

Approval pursuant to Listing Rule 7.1 is not required for the issue of the Shares as approval is being obtained under Listing Rule 10.11. Accordingly, the issue of the Shares to Mr McUtchen (or his nominee/s) will not be included in the Company's 15% annual placement capacity pursuant to Listing Rule 7.1.

The effect of Shareholders passing Resolution 5 will be to allow the Company to issue up to 2,244,898 Shares to Mr McUtchen (or his nominee/s).

If Resolution 5 is not passed, the Company will not be able to proceed with the issue of up to 2,244,898 Shares to Mr Peter McUtchen (or his nominee/s), and the Company will have to

consider alternative commercial means to remunerate Mr McUtchen, including by way of a cash payment.

8.3 Specific information required by Listing Rule 10.13

Pursuant to and in accordance with Listing Rule 10.13, the following information is provided in relation to the proposed issue of Shares:

- (a) The Shares will be issued to Mr Peter McUtchen (or his nominee/s).
- (b) Mr McUtchen is a related party of the Company by virtue of being a Director and falls into the category stipulated by Listing Rule 10.11.1. If Mr McUtchen elects for the Shares to be granted to a nominee, that person will fall into the category stipulated by Listing Rule 10.11.4.

- (d) The Shares will be issued as fully paid ordinary shares and will rank equally in all respects with the Company's existing Shares on issue.
- (e) The Shares will be issued to Mr McUtchen (or his nominee/s) as soon as practicable following the Meeting and in any event not later than one month after the Meeting.
- (f) The Shares will be issued for nil cash consideration and will be provided in lieu of Mr McUtchen's STI Bonus for the financial year ended 30 June 2023.
- (g) The current total annual fixed remuneration package of Mr McUtchen as at the date of this Notice is \$222,000 (inclusive of superannuation). For the financial year ended 30 June 2023, the remuneration of Mr McUtchen was \$229,255 (inclusive of superannuation and share-based payments).
- (h) There are no other material terms to the proposed issue of the Shares.
- (i) A voting exclusion statement is included in the Notice.

8.4 Chapter 2E of the Corporations Act

A summary of Chapter 2E of the Corporations Act is set out in Section 7.4 above.

The proposed issue of the Shares to Mr McUtchen (or his nominee/s) constitutes giving a financial benefit to a related party of the Company.

The Board (with Mr McUtchen abstaining) considers that Shareholder approval pursuant to Chapter 2E of the Corporations Act is not required in respect of the issue of the Shares because the Shares are considered by the Board as reasonable remuneration as they are being issued in lieu of (or partially in lieu of) Mr McUtchen's STI Bonus for the financial year ended 30 June 2023. Therefore, the issue of the Shares falls within the exception stipulated by section 211 of the Corporations Act.

8.5 Additional information

Resolution 5 is an ordinary resolution.

The Board (other than Mr Peter McUtchen who has a personal interest in the outcome of this Resolution) recommend that Shareholders vote in favour of Resolution 5.
